SAMHSA

Program	Description (Funding Totals)
Mental Health Awareness Training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Increases preparedness for communities to respond appropriately and safely to people experiencing mental health challenges (\$4.4 million in 2023)
Healthy Transitions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identifies and provides appropriate behavioral health interventions to transitional age youth (16–25-year-olds) who have or are at risk of serious mental illness (\$11.3 million in 2023)
Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improves mental health outcomes for children 12 and under by developing or improving mental health promotion and treatment services (\$10.9 million remaining in unspent grant funding^{2, 3})
Consumer and Family Network Grants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Strengthens capacity of stakeholders to improve mental health support systems that treat serious mental illness and engage with caregivers (\$2.7 million in total funding across 2022 and 2024)
Mental Health System Transformation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fosters implementation of transformative changes in public mental health service delivery, particularly treatment capacity (\$3.7 million in FY25)
Project LAUNCH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improves mental health wellness of children 8 and under by promoting health social and emotional development (\$21.4 million in 2025)
Primary and Behavioral Health Care Integration Programs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Promotes and improves the integration of behavioral healthcare into primary healthcare settings (\$6 million in 2024)
Assertive Community Treatment for Individuals with Serious Mental Health Illness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Develops assertive community treatment programs to treat serious mental illness in transitional age youth populations (\$5.1 million in 2023)
Minority Fellowship Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recruits, trains, and supports students from racial and ethnic minority populations to enter the behavioral health care profession (\$15.3 million in 2024)
Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking Act Grants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prevents and reduces alcohol use among youth aged 12 – 20 through evidence-based community approaches (\$4.5 million in 2024)

Program	Description (Funding Totals)
Healthy Start	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Provides health services for expecting and new mothers to improve maternal and child health outcomes, including mental health and substance use screening (\$105.3 million in FY24)
Rural Hospital Stabilization Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Provides funding for rural hospitals to expand service lines to meet local needs and offer health care services locally (\$4 million in 2024)
